CONNECT WITH AN AGRICULTURIST IN YOUR COMMUNITY

There are exciting ways to connect with the men and women who grow your food, fiber and natural resources. You may also meet some folks who have other interesting jobs connected to agriculture research, processing, or marketing. Here are some quick ways you can connect to an agriculturist in your community:

- At the grocery store, ask the produce manager when they get new deliveries of fruits and vegetables. Ask if you can visit the store when they are getting a new delivery, and meet the truck drivers who bring fresh produce to your store!
- Visit a local farmers market, and talk to the people who are selling their products.
- Find out if your local high school offers agriculture classes. If they do, see if you can visit with the agriculture teacher or students.
- Contact your county 4-H office and attend a 4-H meeting.
- Find a local fruit stand and ask an adult to take you there. Take some time to visit with the growers.
- Go online, with adult permission, and use a search engine like Google to look up "jobs related to agriculture". Make a list of the jobs that seem most interesting to you.
